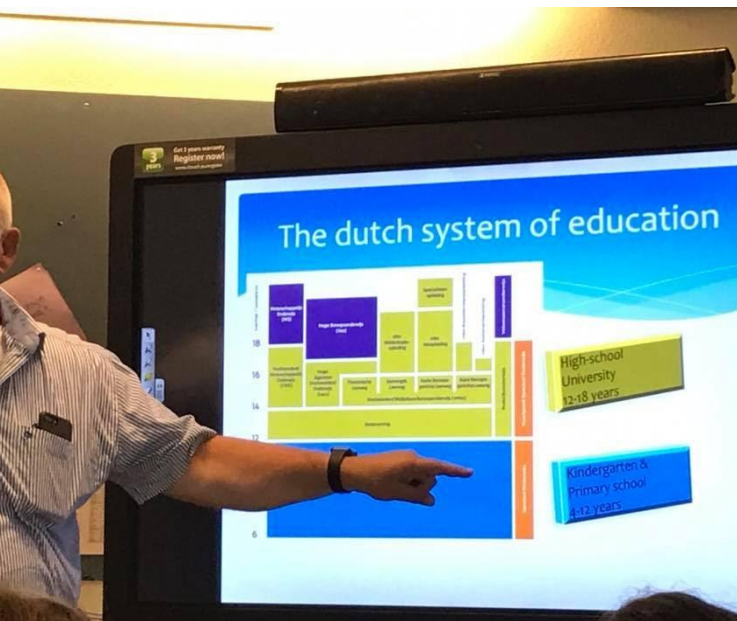
Students will be required to enroll in six (6) credits in the following courses. Courses are designed to fulfill major and general elective requirements.
